# Hope

Tortured by the silence and self-hatred and trying to find some redeeming value in your own life after having your life threatened every moment creates an indefinable terror. # **Information about the EAS Series Project**

In 2007, three surveys were conducted online in English and German by Thorsten Becker, a social worker from Germany, Wanda Karriker, Ph.D., a psychologist from the United States, Carol Rutz, an extreme abuse survivor from the United States, Bettina Overkamp, Ph.D., a psychologist from Germany.

#### The surveys are

the EAS for adult survivors of extreme abuse including, but not limited to, ritual abuse and/or mind control (RA/MC), the P-EAS for professionals who work with survivors, the C-EAS for caregivers of child victims of extreme abuse.

Rationale for development of the surveys is provided in Karriker's (2012) webinar, "Aftereffects of Extreme Child Abuse and Resiliency of the Human Spirit." Relevant empirical research available at the time the EAS was conducted, methodology, limitations, and preliminary findings of the first survey are found in Rutz, Becker, Overkamp and Karriker (2008).

In Becker, Karriker, Overkamp and Rutz (2008), the researchers share preliminary findings of the EAS, P-EAS, and C-EAS regarding dissociative identity disorder (DID) as sequelae of extreme abuse.

Becker, Karriker, Overkamp and Rutz (2014) give an overview (in German) of the Extreme Abuse Survey Project.

#### We Are Not Alone

The findings presented in the EAS Series are powerful validation for extreme abuse survivors. Every number in the tables is the voice of a survivor somewhere in the world, either as self-reported in the EAS, or as reported by their professional helpers (P-EAS) or caregivers (C-EAS). #### **Ritual Abuse Realities**

I am a ritual abuse survivor. I was a victim of such abuse from the time I was two years old until I was nearly thirteen. I was able to function in life relatively well until my early 30's when an episode of severe depression hit. I knew not why.

I entered counseling where eventually it was clear through my recovered memories and abreactions (reliving the trauma through body memories) that I had been satanically ritually abused. This was the time of the False Memory Syndrome Foundation's rise to prominence. Each time I would say an incident was a "false memory," my body memories would escalate until I finally got out of denial. My therapist had to work doubly hard due to their influence on my beliefs that these were false memories. I will go as far to say that the false memory propaganda hindered my recovery to a great extent.

Thus, the efforts of Thorsten Becker, Wanda Karriker, Ph.D., Carol Rutz and Bettina Overkamp, Ph.D. to compile this comprehensive and authoritative document on extreme abuse are a welcomed relief. Their definitive work validates my memories, assures me that I am not "crazy" as I once thought, and comforts me, knowing I am not alone.

Through their research, we now know that ritual abuse and mind control are indeed real, occurring internationally. Their work has documented the rate of occurrence, the nature of extreme abuse perpetrated, the countries involved, the gender statistics, the number of years in therapy, the most effective forms of therapy and much more. 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# **OVERVIEW**

# **Key Findings from the EAS Series**

At a conference sponsored by the International Society for the Study of Trauma and Dissociation (ISSTD) and with input from her co-researchers, Karriker (2008c), presented 10 key findings from the Extreme Abuse Survey Series helpful to understanding RA/MC. They are:

# 1. RA/MC is a global phenomenon.

More than 40 different countries were named.

170 participants did not give their countries of residence.

Numbers of countries named for each survey:

EAS 31 P-EAS 20 C-EAS 19

# 2. A diagnosis of dissociative identity disorder is common for persons who report histories of RA/MC.

#### **EAS**

Of 1007 EAS respondents who answered the related question, 655 (65%) reported that they had been diagnosed with DID. 550 (84% of those who reported DID) chose RA and MC as their primary category of abuse.

393 (77% of 513 who chose "RA and MC" as their primary category of abuse) said that they had been diagnosed DID; whereas, 82 (38% of 214 who chose "Other EA" as their primary category) said that had been diagnosed DID.

69% of 846 females who answered the question "I have been diagnosed with DID (EAS 3-02)," answered, "Yes."

39% of 135 males who answered the question "I have been diagnosed with DID (EAS 3-02)," answered, "Yes."

91% of 11 transgendered who answered the question "I have been diagnosed with DID (EAS 3-02)," answered, "Yes."

#### P-EAS

Of 234 helpers, 85% said the majority of adult RA/MC survivors with whom they have worked have been diagnosed with DID.

#### C-EAS

Of 108 caregivers, 84% have taken care of a child who dissociates when talking or questioned about RA/MC; 74% of 83 have taken care of a child with DID, which they believe is an aftereffect of RA/MC.

3. Ritual abuse (RA) is not limited to SRA, i.e., satanic ritual abuse, sadistic ritual abuse, satanist abuse.

#### <u>EAS</u>

262 respondents (% of 986) answered "No" to the question: "I was ritually abused in a satanic cult."

# 4. RA is reported to involve mind control techniques.

#### **EAS**

Participants were given the opportunity to choose, from four categories, the type of extreme abuse that best describes their experiences as survivors. Of 987 who answered the question, 513 (52%) answered "Ritual Abuse and Mind Control" (RA-MC).

5. Some extreme abuse survivors report that they were used in government-sponsored mind control experimentation (GMC).

#### **EAS**

% (257) of 1000 survivors who answered 1-3: "Secret government-sponsored mind control experiments were performed on me as a child," answered, "Yes."

### P-EAS

Helpers from six countries (US, Canada, Germany, UK, New Zealand, South Africa) and one unnamed country have worked with survivors who have reported GMC experimentation.

32% of 227 helpers have worked with at least one survivor who reported GMC as a child.

20% of 227 helpers have worked with at least one survivor who reported GMC as an adult.

### C-EAS

17% of 76 of caregivers who answered the related question said that children in their care have been abused by government-sponsored mind control "experimenters."

6. RA/MC is reported to be involved in organized "known" crime. Examples include:

#### **EAS**

52% of 1106 reported memories of having been used in pornography as a child.

46% of 1094 reported memories of having been used in prostitution as a child.

#### P-EAS

81% of 223 helpers reported that they had worked with at least one adult who remembered having been used in pornography as a child.

76% of 221 helpers reported that they had worked with at least one adult who remembered having been used in prostitution as a child.

#### C-EAS

52% of 84 caregivers reported that at least one child under their care had disclosed that they had been used in pornography.

40% of 83 caregivers reported that at least one child under their care had disclosed that they had been used in prostitution.

# 7. RA/MC is reported to be involved in clergy abuse.

#### **EAS**

Of 543 survivors who endorsed SRA,

116 (21%) reported memories of SRA and abuse by a Catholic priest.

247 (45%) reported SRA and non-catholic clergy abuse.

74 (14%) reported SRA and abuse by Catholic and non-Catholic clergy.

#### P-EAS

61% of 224 helpers have worked with at least one survivor who reported ritual abuse by clergy.

#### C-EAS

19% of 75 caregivers say that children in their care have been abused by a Catholic priest.

8% of 72 caregivers say that children in their care have been abused by a rabbi.

21% of 75 caregivers say that children in their care have been abused by a Protestant clergy.

# 8. The most often reported memories of extreme abuse are similar across all

surveys. They include physical and sexual abuse from multiple perpetrators and being threatened with death if the victim ever talked about the abuse.

### (Physical Abuse)

#### **EAS**

86% of 1129 respondents to the related question reported that their memories of extreme abuse include physical abuse by multiple perpetrators.

#### P-EAS

96% of 219 respondents to the related question reported that they had worked with at least one survivor whose memories of extreme abuse include physical abuse by multiple perpetrators.

#### C-EAS

81% of 91 respondents to the related question reported that they had provided care for a child or children who disclosed physical abuse by multiple perpetrators.

#### (Sexual Abuse)

#### **EAS**

79% of 1125 respondents to the related question reported that their memories of extreme abuse include sexual abuse from multiple perpetrators.

### P-EAS

94% of 220 respondents to the related question reported that they had worked with at least one survivor whose memories of extreme abuse include sexual abuse by multiple perpetrators.

#### C-EAS

76% of 92 respondents to the related question reported that they had provided care for a child or children who disclosed sexual abuse by multiple perpetrators.

#### (Death Threats)

# **EAS**

77% of 1159 respondents reported that their memories of extreme abuse include

being threatened with death if they ever talked about the abuse.

#### P-EAS

93% of 226 respondents to the related question reported that they had worked with at least one survivor whose memories of extreme abuse include being threatened with death if they ever talked about the abuse.

# C-EAS

80% of 89 respondents to the related question reported that they had provided care for a child or children who disclosed being threatened with death if they ever talked about the abuse.

9. The most often reported possible aftereffects of extreme abuse are similar across all surveys. They include posttraumatic stress disorder, sleep problems, and unusual fears.

#### (Posttraumatic Stress Disorder)

#### **EAS**

89% of 1114 respondents to the related question reported that their possible aftereffects of extreme abuse include posttraumatic stress disorder.

#### P-EAS

99% of 223 respondents to the related question reported that they had worked with at least one survivor whose possible aftereffects of extreme abuse include posttraumatic stress disorder.

#### C-EAS

88% of 85 respondents to the related question reported that they had provided care for a child or children whose possible aftereffects of extreme abuse include posttraumatic stress disorder.

### (Sleep Problems)

#### **EAS**

90% of 1118 respondents to the related question reported that their possible

aftereffects of extreme abuse include sleep problems.

#### P-EAS

97% of 224 respondents to the related question reported that they had worked with at least one survivor whose possible aftereffects of extreme abuse include sleep problems.

### C-EAS

91% of 109 respondents reported that they had provided care for a child or children whose possible aftereffects of extreme abuse include sleep problems.

#### (Unusual Fears)

#### **EAS**

85% of 1110 respondents to the related question reported that their possible aftereffects of extreme abuse include unusual fears.

#### P-EAS

95% of 223 respondents to the related question reported that they had worked with at least one survivor whose possible aftereffects of extreme abuse include unusual fears.

#### C-EAS

86% of 85 respondents to the related question reported that they had provided care for a child or children whose possible aftereffects of extreme abuse include unusual fears.

10. In rating the effectiveness of healing methods, therapists tend to favor stabilization techniques; survivors are more open to alternative ways to cope with indoctrinated belief systems. (Karriker, 2008b).

### A. Countries and Gender (EAS 1-0) [Table 4]

For all countries, females outnumber males and transgendered survivors. For all countries, males outnumber transgendered survivors.

# B. Countries and Current Age (EAS 2-0) [Table 5]

Of 1451 who answered this question, Germany and Unknown have the largest proportions of survivors ages 18-21.

55% of German survivors are below 35; 18% of US survivors are below 35.

8% of German survivors are over 50; 47% of Canadian survivors are over 50.

# **C.** Countries and Formal Education<sup>5</sup> (EAS 3-0) [Table 6]

Of 1446 who answered this question; 56% have at least a college education; 29% have a college degree; 27% have a graduate degree.

# D. Countries and Current Employment (EAS 4-0) [Table 7]

Of 1413 who answered this question, 30% are disabled.

The largest percentage of disabled survivors (45% of 87) is from the UK.

### E. Countries and Years in "Talk" Therapy/Counseling (EAS 5-0) [Table 8]

Of 1448 who answered this question, 20% have never been in therapy/counseling for extreme abuse issues.

28% have been in therapy for more than 9 years.

# **Demographics for Gender Groups: EAS**

# A. Gender and Current Age (EAS 2-0) [Table 9]

Over 50: 32% of 1160 females; 24% of 252 males; 6% of 17 transgendered.

<u>36 - 50</u>: 40% of females; 40% of males; 24% of transgendered.

# **B.** Gender and Formal Education (EAS 3-0) [Table 10]

27% of 1160 females have a graduate degree.

25% of 253 males have a graduate degree.

12% of 17 transgendered have a graduate degree.

57% of females have at least a college degree.

49% of males have at least a college degree.

30% of transgendered have at least a college degree.

# C. Gender and Current Employment (EAS 4-0) [Table 11]

Percentage of disabled transgendered survivors (47% of 17) is higher than for females (31% of 1131) and for males (28% of 250).

# D. Gender and Years in "Talk" Therapy/Counseling (EAS 5-0) [Table 12]

14% of 1160 female survivors have never been in therapy/counseling. 48% of 253 male survivors have never been in therapy/counseling. 6% of 17 of transgendered survivors have never been in therapy/counseling.

32% of females have been in therapy for more than 9 years. 12% of males have been in therapy for more than 9 years. 24% of transgendered survivors have been in therapy for more than 9 years.

# **Comparative Studies: EAS**

### **A.** Types of SRA (EAS, Young et al. and Bottoms et al. [Table 13]

Two studies in the peer-reviewed literature (Young *et al.*, 1991; Bottoms *et al.*, 1996) provide sufficient data with which to compare some of our results. We incorporated all types of satanic ritual abuse reported by Young *et al.* and some of the ritualistic features reported by Bottoms *et al.* into our list of survey statements in the "Memories" section, changing some terminology to make questions for the EAS clearer. Three statements in the Young *et al.* study were two statements in one and we made them two separate items for the EAS.

To compare the proportions of responses on these studies with the proportions of responses on the same or similar items on the EAS, we used the Z-statistic. For 9 out of 10 types of reported abuse there is no statistical difference in frequencies of responses between the Young *et al.* patients and the EAS participants. This means that 90% of the Young *et al.* findings were replicated in our study.

When frequencies of listed responses on the EAS are compared with frequencies reported on the Bottoms *et al.* (1996) study there is a highly significant difference on each item (p.<0.0001). We do not know why the Bottoms *et al.* findings are incongruent with the EAS and Young *et al.* findings. Perhaps the answer lies in the methods in which the different population samples were chosen and/or the ways the data were obtained. Bottoms *et al.* relied on reports of clinical psychologists to supply features of ritual abuse they had heard about from their clients; whereas, Young *et al.* reported information

obtained from their own patients collected from ongoing clinical interviews over a twoyear period.

In contrast to the Young *et al.* criteria that all subjects carry a diagnosis related to dissociation, Bottoms *et al.* reported that 62% of their sample exhibited dissociation with 49% diagnosed as MPD. For the EAS, we relied on self-reports of the 543 survivors who answered yes to the question, "I was ritually abused in a satanic cult." Of those survivors, 82% reported that they had been diagnosed with dissociative identity disorder.

# **B.** Sequelae/Possible Aftereffects of SRA (EAS & Young et al.) [Table 14]

Except for one variable, there are no significant differences between the percentages of EAS participants who report possible aftereffects of abuse in a satanic cult and the percentages of patients reporting similar types of sequelae in the Young *et al.* study. In developing two questions to measure the sequelae that Young et al. refer to as "sexualizations of sadistic impulses" it is possible that we did not accurately reflect what the previous researchers meant by this symptom. If so, this could account for the difference in response rates on this item.

# C. <u>Ritually Abusive Groups (EAS & 1997 German Pilot-Study)</u> [Table 15]

Becker (2008) compared German-language reports of ritually abusive groups [Fröhling and Huber (1997) reported by Becker, 1999] with English-language reports from the EAS. Both German and EAS data show that all ritual abuse is not practiced in satanic cults. It is also practiced in groups founded on other religious or ideological doctrines including Gnostic, fascist, child pornography groups, groups with uncertain etiology, and religious sects. Using the *Z*-test, we found the following:

No significant differences in percentages of reports of destructive cults, which include SRA or Gnostic backgrounds, by the German (1997) group and reports of SRA groups by the English-language EAS group.

No significant difference in percentages of reports of child pornography groups by the German (1997) group and reports of child pornography groups by the English-language EAS group.

Significant differences with the other groups.

# **Ideology of Perpetrator Groups: All Surveys**

**EAS:** [Table 16]

11 items on the EAS addressed survivors' experiences as per gender in selected groups:

Satanic cult (46-3) Fascist (17-3)
Child pornography (48-3) Witchcraft (92-3)
Uncertain (6-3) Catholic clergy (20-3)

Religious sect (16-3) Gnostic (47-3)
Non-Catholic clergy (21-3) Voodooism (93-3)

Government MC (1-3)

Proportions of females are significantly higher than males for Satanic Cult, Child Pornography, Uncertain, and Non-Catholic Clergy (Z-test at 95% 2-tail confidence level).

Transgendered are significantly higher than females for Gnostic groups (*Z*-test at 95% 2-tail confidence level).

Transgendered are significantly higher than males for Child Pornography, Uncertain Etiology, and Non-Catholic Clergy (*Z*-test at 95% 2-tail confidence level).

**P-EAS:** [Results 04]

Professional helpers have worked with survivors who have reported ritual abuse, not only in groups named by EAS participants (above), but also in daycare centers and by polygamist and clergy groups.

C-EAS: [Results 08]

#### Riseman (2003)

Twenty-five members of *Survivorship* responded to a survey for ritual abuse survivors.

# C. Healing Methods (EAS and P-EAS) [Table 19]

For the optional healing methods sections on the EAS and P-EAS, we used 10 alternative healing methods listed on the *Psychology Today* website (www.psychologytoday.com) and arbitrarily selected 43 others known to us as having been used by survivors.

Karriker (2008b) compared responses by survivors (EAS) to responses by helpers (P-EAS). *Z*-values show significant differences in effectiveness ratings by survivors and by helpers for 43% of the healing methods under study. Survivors' ratings are significantly higher than helpers' ratings on the following items:

#### **EMDR**

Helpers, as a group, tended to give higher ratings than survivors for stabilization methods.

Survivors, as a group, tended to give higher ratings than helpers to methods that purport to provide ways to cope with indoctrinated belief systems.

Survivors, as a group, tended to give alternative healing methods higher ratings than did helpers.

## **D.** Healing Methods (C-EAS) [Table 20]

Not all items on the C-EAS healing methods section are identical to those on the other surveys. Table 20 shows proportions of caregivers who found each method to be of much or great help for children in their care.

#### **EAS**

31% (308) of 999 survivors answered yes to "Alternative healing methods have been more effective in helping me to heal than 'talk therapy."

#### EAS, P-EAS, C-EAS

Individual psychotherapy/counseling and supportive friends are considered the most effective healing methods for all survey groups.

Electroshock therapy is considered the least effective healing method for all survey groups.

## E. Dissociation

#### **EAS**

Of 1007 EAS respondents who answered the related question, 655 (65%) reported that they had been diagnosed with DID. 550 (84% of those who reported DID) chose RA and MC as their primary category of abuse.

393 (77% of 513 who chose "RA and MC" as their primary category of abuse) said that they had been diagnosed DID; whereas, 82 (38% of 214 who chose "Other EA" as their primary category) said that had been diagnosed DID.

69% of 846 females who answered the question "I have been diagnosed with DID (EAS 3-02)," answered, "Yes."

39% of 135 males who answered the question "I have been diagnosed with DID (EAS 3-02)," answered, "Yes."

91% of 11 transgendered who answered the question "I have been diagnosed with DID (EAS 3-02)," answered, "Yes."

Of 234 helpers, 85% said the majority of adult RA/MC survivors with whom they have worked have been diagnosed with DID.

#### C-EAS

Of 108 caregivers, 84% have taken care of a child who dissociates when talking or questioned about RA/MC; 74% of 83 have taken care of a child with DID, which they believe is an aftereffect of RA/MC.

#### F. Therapist Neutrality

#### **EAS**

46% of 1013 survivors believe helpers should always take a neutral stance regarding the truth of the survivors' memories.

#### P-EAS

63% of 233 helpers said they always take a neutral stance regarding the truth of an adult survivor's memories of RA/MC.

## **G.** <u>Repressed/Dissociated Memories</u>

#### **EAS**

Before they sought therapy,

64% of 985 survivors had memories of incest,

48% of 977 had memories of RA,

18% of 989 had memories of GMC.

#### P-EAS

65% of 259 helpers said that some of their clients' reports of RA/MC were based on continuous rather than dissociated memories.

# H. Ritual Abuse and Mind Control in School/Daycare Settings

#### **EAS**

24% of 989 survivors answered yes to, "I was taken out of school to another location to be ritually abused and then returned to my school classroom."

#### P-EAS

29% of 223 helpers reported that they had worked with at least one adult who remembered RA/MC in a daycare center.

#### C-EAS

31% of 75 caregivers reported that at least one child under their care had disclosed RA/MC in a daycare center.

## I. Pornography and Prostitution in Childhood

#### **EAS**

52% of 1106 reported memories of having been used in pornography as a child.

46% of 1094 reported memories of having been used in prostitution as a child.

#### P-EAS

81% of 223 helpers reported that they had worked with at least one adult who remembered having been used in pornography as a child.

76% of 221 helpers reported that they had worked with at least one adult who remembered having been used in prostitution as a child.

#### C-EAS

52% of 84 caregivers reported that at least one child under their care had disclosed that they had been used in pornography.

40% of 83 caregivers reported that at least one child under their care had disclosed that they had been used in prostitution.

#### J. Corroboration of RA/MC

#### **EAS**

34% of 986 survivors have heard other survivors, whom they had not previously met, describe the same perpetrators of their own abuse.

32% of 978 have heard other survivors, whom they had not previously met, describe the same places where they were abused.

#### P-EAS

35% of 230 helpers have heard two or more adult RA/MC survivors name the same perpetrators.

40% of 231 have heard two or more adult RA/MC survivors name the same places of abuse.

#### **C-EAS**

# Comparative Responses for Selected Groups: EAS

## **A.** Healing Methods (RA, MC, RA & MC, EA, DID, Therapists) [Table 29]

Karriker (2009) showed a comparison of the effectiveness of 53 healing methods as ranked by survivors on a scale of one to five according to how helpful each one had been in their healing. The first 4 groups represent the 987 survivors who self-selected one of the 4 categories of abuse (RA, MC, RA and MC, and EA) that we included in the survey to serve as mutually exclusive independent variables.

The other groups are survivors who said they had been diagnosed with dissociative identity disorder (DID) and survivors who said they were therapists for other RA/MC survivors. The DID and therapists groups are not mutually exclusive since respondents could have self-selected one of the 4 categories and also answered yes to having been diagnosed DID and/or answered yes to being a therapist for RA/MC survivors:

Each method had been used by 128 to 892 survivors – 128 had used Neurofeedback; 892 had participated in Individual Psychotherapy and/or Counseling.

From the list of 53 healing methods, survivors as a group chose the following as the 5 most effective:

- (1) Individual Psychotherapy/Counseling (75% of 892)
- (2) Supportive Friends (75% of 892)
- (3) Creative Writing (64% of 740)
- (4) Personal Prayer/Meditation (62% of 760)
- (5) Journaling (61% of 830)

Individual Psychotherapy/Counseling was ranked first for 5 out of 6 groups (all but MC).

Personal/Prayer Meditation was ranked first by those who selected MC.

All groups ranked Electroshock Therapy as last.

Other Methods rankings represent unknown variables. Unfortunately, we did not give participants an opportunity to write in additional methods that have been either helpful or unhelpful.

31% of 999 who answered the related question reported that alternative healing methods have been more effective in helping them to heal than "talk therapy."

19% of 989 said they didn't know if alternative healing methods were more effective than "talk-therapy."

19% of 989 said they had received helpful treatment for the possible aftereffects of RA/MC in a hospital

40% of 979 said that they are not currently in psychotherapy/counseling for help with RA/MC issues.

## B. Religious/Spiritual Issues

75% of 994 survivors who answered the related question have a spiritual belief system.

43% of 982 participate in an organized religion.

46% of 960 claim that at least one spiritual leader was involved in their RA/MC abuse. 53% of 996 answered yes to: "Perpetrators have on at least one occasion made me believe that external entities/spirits/demons had taken over my body."

In looking at the EAS data, Currim (2011) found that as a group, survivors who report a spiritual belief system rate the following (methods as significantly more effective than do those who do not have a spiritual belief system: (See Table 34)

Supportive Friends
Personal Prayer/Meditation
Creative Writing
Other Methods
Journaling
Spiritual Guidance/Counseling
Music Therapy

## C. Programming

In Table 35, Karriker (2008) compared the frequencies of reported memories of survivors who are dealing with programs installed by perpetrators with the reported memories of survivors who are not dealing with those programs. They are ranked in order of degree of significance.

Below are the 10 items that show the highest degree of differences between the two groups. All comparisons are given in Table 35.

- 1. Use of blood in abuse.
- 2. Electroshock
- 3. Forced to murder of made to think he/she had murdered a baby.
- Witnessing physical abuse on other victims.
- Forced drugging
- 6. Sensory deprivation
- Witnessing murder
- 8. Witnessing animal mutilations/killings
- 9. Use of feces in abuse
- 10. Being caged

#### A. Responses [Table 30]

EAS participants were given the opportunity to chose, from 4 categories, the type of extreme abuse that *best* describes their experiences as survivors. Of 987 who answered the question,

### **B.** Categories by Countries [Table 30]

Countries with highest percentages for each category:

RA: UK and AU/NZ (27% and %)

MC: CA and AS/AF/SA/ME (14% and 20%) RA-MC: US and AU/NZ (58% and 55%)

Other EA: Germany and Other EU (49% and 31%)

A chi-square analysis for 7 of the 8 country groups was performed (we did not include AS/AF/SA/ME because of the small n) to determine if there are significant differences in the way respondents from different countries categorize their abuse experiences. When 7 countries were compared, the chi-square statistic suggested significant differences (18, N = 987) = 90.29, p-value = 0). When Germany was omitted, no significant differences were found (15, N = 849) = 19.10, p-value = 0.210.

In a similar chi-square analysis we did for Rutz, Becker, Overkamp and Karriker (2008), we noted that half of the contribution to the chi-square (45.95) comes from one cell (Germany/ Other EA). We performed two more chi-square tests to see if one or both of those variables were responsible for the significant distribution. When "Germany" is excluded as a research variable and "Other EA" is included, the distribution is not significant: chi-square (15, N = 849) = 21.14, p < 0.20. When "Other EA" is excluded and "Germany" is included, the distribution is not significant: chi-square (12, N = 773) = 16.48, p < 0.20.

Therefore, if we use only three categories for comparison (1) RA and MC, (2) RA, and (3) MC, there are no significant differences across countries in how respondents classify their ritual abuse and mind control experiences.

## **C.** Categories by Gender [Table 31]

Proportions of females and males who chose RA or Other EA are not significantly different from one another (Z-test at 95% 2-tail confidence level).

Proportions of females and males who chose MC are significantly different from one another (Z-test at 100% 2-tail confidence level) with a higher percentage of males selecting MC.

Proportions of females and males who chose RA-MC are significantly different from one another (Z-test at 100% 2-tail confidence level) with a higher percentage of females selecting RA-MC.

## **D.** Categories and Memories [Table 32]

Using the Z-statistic, a comparison of responses for all 50 memory items on the EAS shows that proportions responses of the group who self-selected "RA & MC" (n=513) as the category that best describes their experiences are significantly different from proportions of responses of the group who self-selected "Other EA" (n=214) at the  $\geq$ 97% 2-tail confidence level. The "RA & MC" group shows higher proportions on all items.

Below are the top 10 items in descending order according to Z-statistic that show significant elevations in proportions of yes responses for RA & MC-reporters versus other EA-reporters:

- 1. Use of blood in abuse
- 2. Forced drugging
- 3. Forced to murder (or made to think I had murdered) a baby
- 4. Buried alive
- 5. Witnessing murder by perpetrators
- 6. Forced participation in murder by perpetrators
- 7. Electroshock
- 8. Forced cannibalism
- 9. Forced to participate in animal mutilations/killings
- 10. Spinning

## **E.** Categories and Possible Aftereffects [Table 33]

For the 34 aftereffect items on the EAS, we compared responses of the group who self-selected "RA & MC" (n=513) as the category that best describes their experiences with the group who self-selected "Other EA" (n=214). Using the Z-statistic, we found significant differences between the groups on 27 items with the "RA & MC" group showing higher proportions on all 27 items at the  $\geq$ 97% 2-tail confidence level.

Below are the top 10 items in descending order that show significant elevations in proportions of yes responses for RA & MC-reporters versus other EA-reporters:

- 1. Dissociative flashbacks with satanic themes
- 2. Dealing with programs installed by perpetrator(s)
- 3. Mysterious ailments for which a diagnosis cannot be made
- 4. Beliefs indoctrinated by perpetrator(s)
- 5. Survivor guilt
- 6. Sexual urges triggered by feelings of threat, fear, shame, guilt, etc
- 7. Other possible aftereffects of Extreme Child Abuse
- 8. Suicidal thoughts around special holidays, birthdays, etc.
- 9. Unexplained bruises and wounds
- 10. Substance abuse

# Personal Experiences: EAS

# **A.** By Total Sample, Countries, Languages [Table 27]

Table 27 shows proportions of personal experiences endorsed by total sample of survivors and across country groups and English and German language groups. It also shows frequencies for four non-exclusive groups: SRA & GMC, SRA & Other Abuses, DID, and Non-DID. Highlighted cells represent items that are one of the 20 most frequently reported personal experiences for each country group. Two or more items can be tied for 20th place.

Chart 4 lists the 10 most frequently endorsed personal experiences in decreasing frequencies for total group, for English-language group, and for German-language

group. Six items are in the top 10 items for both English and German groups: 2, 50, 63, 65, 87, 88.

Highlighted cells represent items that are one of the 20 most frequently reported personal experiences for each group. More than one item can be tied for 20th place.

Chart 5 lists the 10 most frequently endorsed personal experiences in decreasing frequencies for female group, for male group, and for transgendered group. Six items are tied for 9th and 10th places in the transgendered group.

Three items are in the top 10 items for each group: 63, 87, 88.

Five items are in the top 10 for both the female and male groups: 3, 63, 81, 87, 88.

Seven items are in the top 10 for both the female and transgendered groups: 2, 63, 69, 76, 83, 87, 88.

## **Personal Experiences: P-EAS**

## **A.** RA/MC Survivors Compared with Other EA Survivors

Section 03 of the P-EAS gave helpers the opportunity to compare their experiences with Survivors of EA (Extreme Abuse other than RA/MC) with their experiences with Survivors of RA/MC. Questions addressed diagnosis, treatment, memories, perpetrators, external entities, harms and threats to helpers, corroboration of reports, legal action by victims, and therapist consultation and supervision.

Table 37 shows significant differences as noted by helpers between their experiences with RA/MC survivors versus other EA survivors.

Table 38 shows non-significant differences as noted by helpers between their experiences with RA/MC survivors versus other EA survivors.

Using the Z-test for two proportions, we found significant differences at the 2-tail 95% confidence level between helpers' experiences with clients who report other EA versus those who report RA/MC on 19 of 33 variables under study. As group, P-EAS participants have observed the following:

## 1. Their RA/MC clients are more likely than their other EA clients to . . .

- Have been diagnosed DID.
- Make more suicide attempts (however there are no significant differences in actual suicides).
- Discover that what they had believed were external perpetrators are really internal perpetrators.
- Threaten therapists (however there are no significant differences in actual harm to therapists).
- Report "memories" of an improbable event that was possibly staged to make the victim believe that it happened.
- Remember seeing perpetrator(s) wearing white doctors' coats.
- Remember a perpetrator who addressed himself as a doctor and used a color as his surname.
- Report that the Nazi-war criminal Dr. Josef Mengele was involved in his/her abuse.
- Have been reporting back to his/her perpetrator(s) while in therapy without respondent's knowledge.
- Claim current abuse while in therapy.

## 2. Their other EA clients are more likely than RA/MC clients to . . .

- Remember their abuse before entering psychotherapy with anyone.
- Have successfully sued their perpetrator(s) in civil court.
- Have never met the diagnostic criteria for DID.

# 3. They are more likely for their RA/MC clients than for other EA clients to ...

- Have accompanied them to the scenes of their abuse.
- Have heard two or more clients name the same places(s) of abuse.
- Have heard two or more clients name the same perpetrator(s).
- Have observed what appear to be external entities which have attached to and/or exerted some control over their clients.
- Have been threatened by alleged perpetrators in apparent retaliations for working with their victims (however there are no significant differences in actual harm to therapists).
- Be in need of an experienced supervisor/consultant who is knowledgeable about the treatment of their RA/MC clients.

## **B.** Beliefs About RA/MC

3% (9) of 283 helpers do not believe any of their clients who report RA/MC experienced RA. (P-EAS: 02\_05)

5% (14) of 276 helpers do not believe any of their clients who report RA/MC experienced MC. (P-EAS: 02\_06)

12% (28) of 240 helpers answered that they have worked with at least one adult whose "memories" of RA/MC can be accounted for, in part, by the misuse of hypnosis and/or regressive therapies by a previous therapist. (P-EAS 03 #2)

52% of 235 believe improbable events involving RA/MC might possibly have been "staged" to make victims believe they happened. (P-EAS 03 #4)



Rationale for this Preliminary Study

Ten years ago, the therapeutic community faced the first criminal trial involving charges against therapists in connection with "false" or "recovered" memories of ritual abuse. Although charges were dismissed in March 1999, the phenomenon of RA/MC remains a controversial issue among therapists, counselors, investigators, and in the courts. Only a few empirical studies in peer-reviewed journals provide descriptive data reported by adult survivors regarding the types of ritual abuse they have experienced and its mental and physical sequelae. No studies involve interviews with survivors of mind control experimentation or

professionals who have worked with them.

Ritual abuse and mind control can be considered specific categories of extreme abuse. There are no widely accepted definitions in the academic or survivor literature for the terms "extreme abuse," "ritual abuse," or "mind control." For purposes of this online questionnaire, the surveyors assume that participants will define these terms within their own frames of reference. In some of the survey questions, we distinguish between "extreme abuse (other than RA/MC)" and "RA/MC."

The C-EAS, in both English and German, is the third (and final) in a series of online surveys designed to explore commonalities reported by survivors of extreme abuse. The first survey was for adult survivors of all types of extreme abuse; the second, for persons who have worked professionally with extreme abuse survivors. Provided by S.P.ORG., a non-governmental organization in Germany, this trilogy of anonymous surveys was developed privately by Carol Rutz, Thorsten Becker, Bettina Overkamp, Ph.D. and Wanda Karriker, Ph.D.

The C-EAS is for persons who have served as caregivers for children who have made disclosures consistent with ritual abuse and associated traumatic mind control procedures designed to ensure victims' loyalty to the perpetrator(s) or perpetrator groups.

#### Definitions

**Caregiver:** A person who has provided physical, psychological, medical, spiritual, legal, educational and/or other types of support to at least one child victim of RA/MC who was under 18 at the time the care was given.

**Ritual Abuse and Mind Control (RA/MC):** There are no widely accepted definitions in the academic or survivor literature for the terms "ritual abuse" and "mind control." For purposes of this questionnaire the surveyors operationally define "ritual abuse and mind control" using the definition for "ritual violence" proposed by Becker and Fröhling:

Ritual Violence is a severe form of abuse of adults, adolescents and children intended to traumatize the victims. It consists of physical, sexual and psychological forms of abuse which are planned out and systematically used in ceremonies. These ceremonies may have an ideological background as well as being staged for the purpose of deception and threat. Symbols, activities or rituals which have religious, magical or supernatural connotation are used. The purpose is to confuse, threaten and terrorize victims as well as indoctrinate them with religious, spiritual or ideological beliefs. Ritual violence rarely consists of a single episode. Most often these experiences happen over an extended period of time.

RA includes, but is not limited to, Satanic Ritual Abuse (SRA).

MC refers to all mind control procedures designed to make a victim follow directives of the perpetrator without conscious awareness including, but not limited to, non-consensual mind control experimentation.

The survey should take less than 20 minutes to complete. Some of the questions may be triggering to respondents who are abuse survivors. You may stop at anytime and you do not have to complete the survey.
